Plus, you are invited to call the telephone numbers listed above at any time for additional information.
- 3. Will I receive any recognition for my participation in this activity? Yes, each participant who fully completes the requirements of the activity will be recognized at the Annual Roundtable Breakfast and receive a certificate of participation for his/her efforts. In addition, names of all participants will be listed on the breakfast program. A group picture will be taken at the breakfast and shared with the media.
